

Project programmed on the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) through the Boston Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Pre-25% Initial Design Concepts Submitted to MassDOT **Sept. – July** 2022 2023

Intersection Control Evaluation (ICE) Alternatives Analysis

October 2023

Preliminary (25%) Design and ROW Submitted to MassDOT

January – March

25% Design Refinement and Utility Coordination






Why was this project initiated?

Existing Intersection

- Additional capacity needed to
 improve vehicular traffic operations
 - Single lane on intersection approaches
 - No dedicated turn lanes
- No bike accommodations and narrow shoulder width
- Minimal sidewalk / pedestrian accommodations
- Bus stops do not meet current standards







What do we want to accomplish?

Project Goals



Enhance safety of the intersection



Improve vehicular operations



Integrate all roadway users





What alternatives were considered?

Project Alternatives

Alternative 1 – Signalized Intersection

- Dedicated turn lanes on all approaches
- On street buffered bike lanes
- Sidewalks on all approaches

Alternative 1A – Signalized Intersection

- Dedicated turn lanes on all approaches
- Hybrid of on street bike lanes and separated bike lanes
- Sidewalks on all approaches

Alternative 2 – Roundabout

- Two-lane roundabout required
- Shared use paths on all approaches

Proposed Improvements

CAMBRIDGE STREET (RT. 3&3A)

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- Dedicated Left Turn lanes on Cambridge Street • Dedicated Right Turn lanes on Bedford Road \bullet and South Bedford Street
- New traffic signal system \bullet

11' Travel Lanes, 10' Turn Lanes

Proposed Improvements

CAMBRIDGE STREET (RT. 3&3A)

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- 5' sidewalks on both sides of each approach
- New ADA complaint pedestrian curb ramps
- Combined 10' sidewalk at curb ramps and intersection corners "Mixing Zones"
- Crosswalks on each leg of the intersection


• Bus stops optimally located with allocated space outside of travel lanes



Preliminary Right of Way (ROW) discussion 25% Design Public Hearing


- MassDOT is responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of this project.
 - Fee takings, permanent easements and/or temporary construction easements may be required.
 Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the MassDOT ROW Bureau or
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the consultants representing the responsible agency.
 - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
 If project receives federal funds, property owners are further protected under Title III of the Re
 - If project receives federal funds, property owners are further protected under Title III of the Real Property Act of 1970, as amended.
- Preliminary ROW drawings will be available at Woburn Town Hall for public review and comment.

At this stage of design, the Right of Way process has not been finalized. This meeting is an opportunity for the public to comment on any impacts to properties.





What are the environmental, cultural resource, and comunity impacts?



Wetland Resource Areas

- Project limits within
 Buffer Zone of Bordering
 Vegetated Wetland (BVW)
- No impacts within wetland resources



Article 97 Land Impacts

- Roadway improvements along South Bedford Street and the west side of Cambridge Road will minimally impact Article 97 land (Mary Cummings Park)
- Mitigation for impacts have been previously coordinated by the Town of Burlington
 - Conservation Restriction created for ±9 acres for intersection impact land replacement





Environmental Permitting

Anticipated Environmental Permits Required:

- Wetlands Protection Act (WPA) Notice of Intent (NOI) lacksquare
- Article 97 Legislature lacksquare
- Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act (MEPA) Expanded Environmental ${\bullet}$ Notification Form (EENF) / Environmental Impact Report (EIR)
 - Project located within 1 mile of Environmental Justice (EJ) population
- National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Programmatic Categorical \bullet Exclusion (CE)







Construction Phase

Roadway Impacts

- Daily lane shifts throughout construction
- One lane of traffic in both directions
 maintained at all times during peak
 travel times
 - Occasional lane closures anticipated during off-peak travel times
- No planned detours
- Access will be maintained to abutting homes and businesses
- Pedestrian accommodations and bus stop access will be maintained





Road User Impacts During Construction

Communication

- MassDOT will provide notifications to the public on anticipated traffic impacts
- Construction notifications coordinated with City of Woburn & Town of Burlington
- Ongoing information will be posted on the town's websites
